Course Objectives:

- Learn rapid provisionalization techniques.
- Understand smile design and occlusion.
- Develop skills in laboratory communication

Course Dates:

October 29, 2004: Lecture / Rapid provisionalization techniques. Advantages of medium term (5-6 weeks) provisional wear. Live Patient / Exam and treatment plan with a live patient including functional analysis and smile design. Best case types would be cosmetic cases needing implants, gum lifts or minor tooth movement.

November 19, 2004: Lecture / Pre and post treatment debriefing. Live Patient / Multidisciplinary cosmetic cases, tooth preparation and provisionalization.

January 7, 2005: Lecture / Treatment planning for a functionally complex case involving bruxism, periodontal disease or TMJ. Live Patient / Seat the case that was prepared in November.

February 4, 2005: Lecture/ Pre and post -op debriefing. Live Patient/ Prepare functionally complex case.

March 11, 2005: Lecture/ Pre and post op debriefing and wrap up. Live Patient/ Seat the restorations on the functionally compromised patient.
